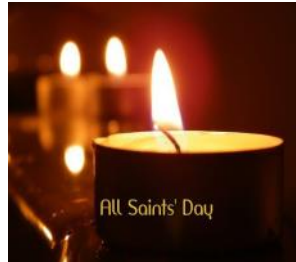


## ALL SAINTS' SERVICE OF REMEMBRANCE

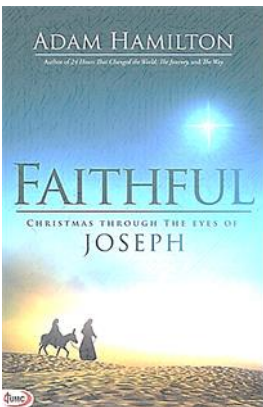


## CARGILL'S ADVENT STUDY

This study will help us to learn to accept and glorify God's will even when situations in our life make it difficult to do so.

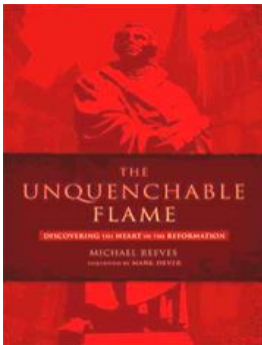
