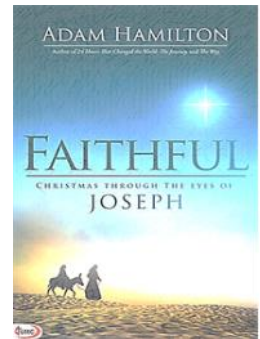

- Jan 27 & 28 Fourth Sunday after the Epiphany
